Sub: Grant of Conditional Permission to Aligarh Unani Medical College & ACN Hospital, Aligarh, with 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course and 08 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Kulliyat -04 seats (ii) Noalijat-04 seats for the academic session 2021-22 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above, the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59(2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. However, GOI, Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter no. L.14011/3/2020-EP (1) dated 26.03.2021 and 15.04.2021 issued Relaxation/support policy for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the academic session 2021-22 and the college will be considered on the basis of part-I visitation proforma submitted by the college provided that the college shall submit an undertaking & indemnity bond, stating that they shall fulfill respective requirements in terms of required teaching and training facilities specified in the relevant regulations throughout the academic year. Further, as per point no. "P" of above said relaxation policy and as per direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, college was virtually visited on dated **08.12.2021**.

In view of above, the college had been assessed on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the Ministry of AYUSH and visitation report submitted by the visitors. On examining in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Unani Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Unani Education) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, it was found that the College was not fulfilling notified and approved criteria for Granting Conditional Permission for UG (BUMS) and PG courses for A.Y. 2021-22.

Further, on examining the same, certain deficiencies had been observed and therefore, under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, **an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 19.01.2022 to present the case through virtual mode.**

The observations of Medical Assessment Board on the submission made by the college concerning being deemed and assessment report of the college have been reviewed and approved by the Board. The Board has decided to grant permission to the college to start the academic session 2022-23 with 40 seats in the (Bachel) course and 40 seats in the PG courses namely 11 seats in Bachelor of BSc (H) and 29 seats in the (Bachel) course and 40 seats in the PG courses namely 11 seats in Bachelor of BSc (H) and 29 seats in the (Bachel) course.

2. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine to grant Conditional Permission to start (Undergraduate) Bachelor of BSc (H) and 29 seats in the (Bachel) course and 40 seats in the PG courses namely 11 seats in Bachelor of BSc (H) and 29 seats in the (Bachel) course for the academic session 2022-23 subject to the following conditions:
 3. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Memorandum/Requirements have submitted by the college.
 4. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of procedure for and fee income to the Institute, and teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and students paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1947 & PPF Act, 1936 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
3. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of all the (Bachel) seats and PG seats in the PG courses namely 11 seats in Bachelor of BSc (H) and 29 seats in the (Bachel) course shall be treated as all India quota. The counselling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counselling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counselling for the remaining 25% seats of all India quota may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counselling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota of the students admitted thereunder.
4. Admissions made in violation of the aforesaid conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
5. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
6. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the institution before applying for the session 2022-23 (before opening of Part-I proforma) to get permission for the session 2022-23:
 - i. all the requirements of Minimum Standard of Infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Unani Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - ii. all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Unani);
 - iii. all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Unani) regulations, 2016;
 - iv. all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
7. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2022-23.
